

# Rescue Hook & Ladder Company

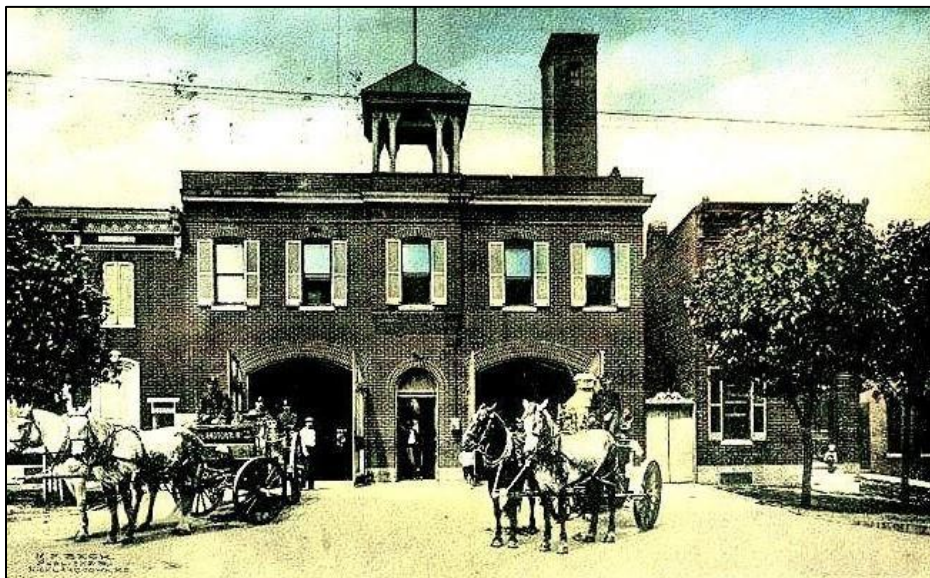
## Highlandtown

The Rescue Hook & Ladder Company was organized on December 30, 1873 on the west side of Main St., (Conkling St.) between Bank St. and Eastern Ave. in the center of Highlandtown. On September 19, 1875 the corner-stone of the engine house was laid for a building twenty-four feet by seventy-five feet. The following officers were elected: President, William Schulutenberger; Vice-President, George Raub; Treasurer Frederick Heirm; and Secretary, Frederick Weissner.

The volunteer fire company remained an active part of the community until 1881 when the building was rented to Baltimore County for a new career fire station, Engine 6, in 1882 Engine 6 was renumbered to Engine 7. Baltimore County occupied the building until 1893 when a new fire station was built on Main St., south of Eastern Ave.
